Working group responsibilities

Leadership, articulation and institutionality

In accordance with the provisions of Decree 357/016, the working group tasks are:

- Coordinate and monitor all stages of the process of elaboration, consultation and participation in the National Open Government Plans.
- Prepare the Open Government Action Plan and recommend its approval to the Executive Branch.
- Monitor the progress and fulfillment of the goals of each commitment.
- Collaborate with public entities in the elaboration of their commitments in the context of the Alliance for Open Government.
- Create the necessary work groups to implement the stages of the co-creation process.

Ensure the sustainability of the Open Government processes

How the Working Group works

It seeks to transform the group into a team, where trust and dialogue, enable a constructive space of work

Activity details

Meeting

- Ordinary meetings once a month
- Extraordinary meetings: In the design stage of co-creation process, weekly meetings are held
- The calendar is defined and agreed, and approved by minutes.

Transparency

- There is a mini website where all the group information is published
- Minutes of all meetings are published
- Annual Management Reports

Decisions

- Consensus is prioritized
- Horizontality in the proposals
- All agreements, dissent and decisions are recorded in meeting minutes

Culture of Open Government

- They promote the values of Open Government by promoting awareness and training in Open Government to officials of the State, Civil Society, in Secondary Education and in continuing education courses at Universities.

Co-creation process

The process is design and agreed by the Open Government workgroup and approved by the authorities.

Stages of the process	Activities
Stage1. Kick-off and participatory process	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Formal launch of the process • Induction to all actors, talks, workshops and open government course • E- participation platform, Dialogue tables
Stage 2. Priorization	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Systematization of proposals and feasibility analysis • Cocreation workshop: Create commitments draft • Publication of responses to each proposal
Stage 3. Public consultation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Public Consultation • Systematization, processing and feasibility analysis of the proposals • Publication of responses to each proposal and evaluation of the participation process
Stage 4. Approve and publication	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Creation of final document, validated for all public institutions involved. • Validation and approval by Executive Branch Decree . • Start up of platform “Mirador de Gobierno Abierto” (On line platform)

In Uruguay have 3 spaces for Dialogue

- 1) Open Government workgroup;
- 2) Spaces and platforms for dialogue and co-creation were established through round-table discussion, work groups and specific workshops to debate and exchange ideas and proposals for commitments,
- 3) Virtual spaces in the proposal management and public consultation platform

Some features

- It's encouraged the presentation of proposals and consensus
- There is total transparency of proposals: All proposals are registered on the platform and are answered, the reports of each instance are also published.
- All processes are evaluated by the participants
- The authorities of each policy support the spaces for dialogue

Criteria for integration of commitments:

General criteria:

- Contribute to OGP values .
- Contribute to the SDG.
- SMART commitments.

Selection criteria:

- Commitments cocreated.
- Commitments created from areas of citizen participation.
- Transversal projects.
- Impact on local communities or a specific population.
- Continuity of existing commitments.
- Contribute to a priority public policy.

Structuring criteria:

All commitments must include at some stage of their formulation to civil society and / or direct beneficiaries of the commitment.

They must be the product of:

- a. A co-creation process or,
- b. Agreements reached from proposals into participation spaces or,

in case of a commitment that does not arise from the literals a. and b. its incorporation into the plan will be subject to the decision by consensus of the Government Working Group.

Implementation criteria:

- All commitments must be integrated for monitoring and monitoring at the Open Government Viewpoint,
- Publicity of the commitments.

Note: These criteria correspond to the 4th PAN, for the 5th one is working on new criteria.

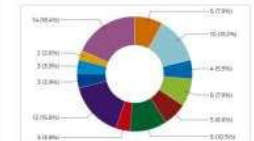
