El Salvador. The Government of El Salvador has taken an active role in combating prejudice against those with disabilities by implementing the FEMCIDI financed, "School Inclusion Program". The program has an objective of integrating 200 children with disabilities into the public school system.

Chile. During September 22 and 23, a panel of experts gathered to partake in the "Tyler Regional Workshop: Key Scientific Questions Relevant for Biodiversity Conservation in South America." The goal of the workshop was to discuss topics in the field of biodiversity conservation that need additional funding and to later inform governing bodies of the conservation issues that require more research. The workshop was produced in part from funding from OAS Partnership for Development Fund, FEMCIDI, as well as support from the Chilean Ministry of Environment and the University of Chile.
